Spouses of active military personnel will be provided preferential consideration in NAF vacancies. These are filled through competitive means at the NF-3 and below, or equivalent hourly rate position and all employment categories. To qualify, spouses must show proof of marriage prior to PCS move, the sponsor's duty station, and reporting date. www.secnav.navy.mil/donhr/how-to-apply/military-spouses/pages/default.aspx
